Creighton OTD Locations: Learn Where You Live

Creighton's Occupational Therapy program is offered across four distinct locations, each built around the same curriculum, outcomes and support system and shaped by the community it serves.

Creighton's OTD program offers two learning formats, on-campus and hybrid, so you can choose the experience that fits your goals. You'll also learn from Creighton faculty across all locations, with ongoing support from advisors and mentors.

A Curriculum Built for Connection and Flexibility

Students across all pathway locations engage in synchronous (live) and asynchronous learning (recorded), complemented by in-person lab instruction led by experienced faculty. Omaha offers a fully in-person, immersive campus experience with daily interaction, hands-on labs and interprofessional learning opportunities. Hybrid (blended learning) students access live-streamed or recorded lectures, with lab sessions delivered by adjunct faculty in close collaboration with our Omaha-based team.

Omaha Program

On Creighton's Omaha campus, students experience a traditional, face-to-face learning environment and daily interaction with faculty and classmates. **As Creighton's largest OTD cohort, Omaha offers the energy and connection of a full campus community.**

Coursework and hands-on labs take place in the CL and Rachel Werner Center for Health Sciences Education, where OT students learn alongside students in medicine, nursing, pharmacy and physical therapy. This collaborative environment fosters the communication and teamwork skills needed in today's healthcare settings. Students also gain experience through clinical placements across the region and beyond.

Alaska Hybrid Pathway

The Anchorage Hybrid pathway is offered in partnership with the University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA), creating the state's only OT program. Lectures are delivered online, while labs are held on the UAA campus.

Students benefit from a close-knit learning environment, smaller lab groups and instruction from local clinicians who connect coursework to patient care. **The pathway prepares students to serve rural and Alaska Native communities where need is high and resources may be limited.**

Regis Hybrid Pathway

The Regis Hybrid pathway in Denver is offered in partnership with Regis University, another Jesuit institution with a longstanding commitment to healthcare education and service. For more

than 10 years, the partnership has provided a collaborative learning environment rooted in shared values and community engagement. Students complete lectures online and hands-on labs in the Denver area. **Small groups with two faculty members in each lab and instruction from practicing clinicians connect coursework to patient care.**

Phoenix Hybrid Pathway

The Phoenix Hybrid Pathway combines online learning with hands-on education. Students complete experiential learning on Creighton's health sciences campus in Midtown, where Phoenix occupational therapy faculty collaborate with colleagues in Omaha to lead lab instruction. Throughout the curriculum, students gain practical experience working with standardized patients, in home care settings and through other learning experiences that prepare them for practice.

Smaller lab groups provide individualized instruction while local clinicians connect coursework to patient care. **The pathway offers the same curriculum, expectations and outcomes as Creighton's other OTD locations.** The hybrid format can also support part-time work or other responsibilities, while community partnerships, such as Barrow Neurological Institute, First Place AZ and the Arizona Burn Center introduce students to the region's healthcare needs and strengths.

On-campus Learning vs. Hybrid Learning

On-campus (Omaha):

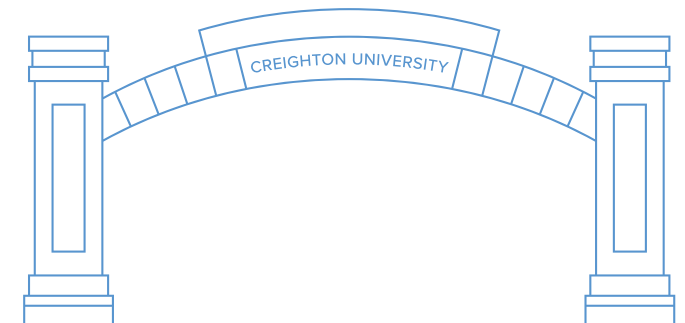
- Attend classes and labs on the Omaha campus with daily interaction with faculty and peers
- Participate in hands-on learning integrated throughout your weekly schedule
- Access Creighton's Omaha simulation spaces, standardized patients, campus resources and student life

Hybrid (Phoenix, Denver, Anchorage):

- Attend lectures online: You can join the livestream or watch on your schedule
- Complete exams online with an online proctor
- Complete in-person labs 2–4 days per week at your location—you'll participate in hands-on learning working with peers, standardized patients and community partners
- Hybrid pathways offer flexibility in how you learn. Because labs take place multiple days each week, you'll need to live in your pathway city to complete the program.

Admission Information

We know you’ve worked hard, and we want to help make the next step as smooth as possible. We love talking to prospective students and encourage you to schedule an appointment with our admission staff.

Application Process

The Creighton University School of Pharmacy and Health Professions Occupational Therapy program participates in the centralized application service OTCAS. Applicants are encouraged to apply early. We review applications on a rolling basis and award admission-based scholarships throughout the admission cycle. Once interview seats are full, we may be unable to interview additional qualified candidates.

Before completing your application, please learn more about our admissions requirements below.

To apply, applicants must submit all the following materials through otcas.org, an occupational therapy centralized application service, which includes:

- An official transcript must be submitted to OTCAS from each institution the applicant has attended and/or is currently attending. Official transcripts must be received directly from the issuing institution(s).
- Three letters of recommendation.
- Observation in an OT setting supervised by a licensed occupational therapist.
 - Applicants will be considered for an interview prior to the completion of observations. Admitted candidates will be required to complete their observations by August 1 of the year they matriculate.

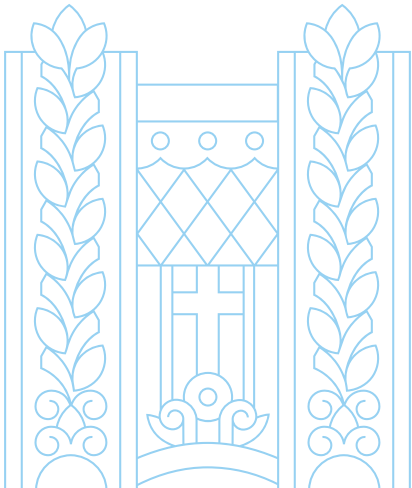
Prerequisites

For admission into the Doctor of Occupational Therapy programs at Creighton University, you must meet the following requirements:

- A minimum of 60 semester hours or 90 quarter hours of prerequisite coursework.
- Prerequisite courses may be completed at any regionally accredited institution and must be completed with a grade of C or better (a C- grade is not acceptable). All prerequisite coursework must be completed by August 1 of the desired year of entry.

Scholarships

Creighton is committed to making an exceptional OT education accessible. In fact, 100% of incoming OTD students receive scholarship funding, with initial awards ranging from \$19,500 to \$57,000 distributed over the three-year program. All admitted students are automatically considered for scholarships, no separate application is required. Awards are based on a holistic review of your application, including academic achievement, essays, interview performance and service and leadership experiences. Because scholarships are awarded on a rolling basis, applying early provides the greatest opportunity for consideration.
