# Senior Awards

For those pharmacy graduates who received awards in their final year, the awards are listed with their names.

The Robert I. Garis Memorial Scholarship is an annual award in memory of Dr. Robert Garis. Dr. Garis was a most respected and distinguished member of the pharmacy faculty and this scholarship through its awardee reflects the outstanding characteristics of him. The scholarship is awarded on the basis of a student's attributes in the practice and science of pharmacy administration and social and economic justice in the application of medications in the care of patients. The award is made possible by the generous gifts of dedicated alumni and members of Pharmaceutical Technologies, Inc. The awarded student will be designated as a "Garis Scholar."

In 1979 Mr. and Mrs. Bernard J. Ghiglieri Jr. established the Jane A. Ghiglieri Scholarship in memory of their daughter, a 1977 summa cum laude graduate of the Creighton University School of Pharmacy, who passed away from leukemia a year later at the age of 24. The campus-based P3 student named as a Jane A. Ghiglieri Scholar must have a demonstrated history of academic excellence, outstanding leadership, and extraordinary service to fellow students, the School and external communities. While Jane's parents are now deceased, her devoted brother Bernard J. Ghiglieri III, has provided sustaining support for the Scholarship. For this, the School and its pharmacy students will be forever grateful.

The Wolters Kluwer Clinical Drug Information Award of Excellence in Clinical Communication is given to a student who exhibits high scholarship and demonstrates superior clinical communication skills.

The Merck & Company Award is presented to graduating students who have achieved outstanding scholastic achievement in their pharmacy studies.

The United States Public Health Service Excellence in Public Health Pharmacy Award is awarded to a student who has made significant contributions to public health by promoting wellness and heathy communities.

The Pharmacy Communications Award is presented to a fourth-year student who applies knowledge in practice, serves as a professional role model, and provides guidance and compassion to patients. The Excellence in Nonprescription Medication Award

is presented to a fourth-year pharmacy student who exhibits excellent patient counseling skills on nonprescription medications. This award is sponsored by the Department of Pharmacy Sciences.

**The Commitment to Pharmacy Award** is presented to a fourth-year student who exhibits ideals of professionalism and excellence in patient care and has demonstrated exceptional service and commitment to the profession of pharmacy. This award is sponsored by the Department of Pharmacy Practice.

The Creighton Excellence in Clinical Practice Award

is presented to fourth-year students who have shown outstanding performance on clinical rotations.

The Creighton "Pride in Pharmacy" Award is presented to student leaders who enhance the profession through involvement in professional activities and community service, show characteristics of leadership and are influential with peers.

**The Clinical Pharmacy Award** is given to a student in the fourth year of pharmacy, who has the intention of pursuing a career in clinical pharmacy, is in good academic standing, and excels in leadership, academics, and has a positive outlook in advancing the profession.

The Viatris Excellence in Pharmacy Award is awarded to a student with high scholarship who has demonstrated superior proficiency in providing drug information.

The Creighton Pharmacy Practice Achievement Award is awarded to students who have exhibited overall excellence in scholastic achievement, leadership, and extracurricular activities.

# **Traditions of Creighton**



# **Creighton Seal**

The Creighton University seal includes elements representing the Creighton family, Creighton's Jesuit tradition and the Omaha Archdiocese.

The gold stripes on the red field, in the upper left-hand quadrant of the shield, come from the family coat of arms of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). The lion rampant comes from the Creighton family coat of arms, and the three seashells on a field of white and red sable come from the Wareham family coat of arms—paying homage to Creighton University's founding families. The design for the shield's final quadrant, in the lower left, comes from the coat of arms of the Archdiocese of Omaha. The starburst behind the shield comes from the seal of the Society of Jesus.



# **Ceremonial Mace**

In the Middle Ages, the mace was a club used in battle and carried by a bodyguard to defend a person of authority. Over the years, it began to lose its warlike image and became a symbol of peaceful leadership.

At an academic institution, the mace is the symbol of the legal and chartered authority of the leadership to whom the board of trustees has delegated authority. When the ceremonial mace is present, the authority of the University is present. Use of the mace is reserved for occasions of outstanding importance, and it is an honor to bear the mace.

The Creighton University mace was designed and fashioned by Brian K. Besack, operations supervisor of the University's carpenter shop, at the invitation of then president, the Rev. John P. Schlegel, sJ, to commemorate the 125th anniversary of the University.

Using a cherry wood baluster from a long-abandoned staircase in the attic of Creighton Hall, the oldest building on Creighton's campus, Besack designed and fashioned the shaft, head and foot of the mace. Each facet of the nine-sided head displays a bronze, gold-plated medallion bearing the name and founding date of the University's schools and colleges. Its foot is sheathed in gold-plated brass, and cradled in its shaft rests the official seal of the University. At its top, the mace is crowned with a three-dimensional blue and gold medallion symbol of the Society of Jesus.

# **Graduation Honors**

Graduation honors are awarded to the top 15% of the students in each graduating class who have at least a 3.65 grade-point average (GPA). Graduation honors are based on a student's work while enrolled in a professional program in the School of Pharmacy and Health Professions at Creighton University. To be eligible for graduation honors, a student must have completed at least half of the prescribed semester hours for the degree in the School while enrolled at Creighton University. The diploma of a student who qualifies for graduation honors is inscribed "with Honors."

The School of Pharmacy and Health Professions chapters of academic and leadership honor societies provide their members with special cords to wear over their academic regalia signifying their membership.

Alpha Sigma Nu is unique among honor societies in that it seeks to identify the most promising students in Jesuit colleges and universities who demonstrate a commitment to the ideals of Jesuit higher education: scholarship, loyalty, and service. Invitation to  $A\Sigma N$  is one of the highest honors bestowed at these institutions. Today's graduating students who have been so honored wear a gold medallion with a maroon ribbon.

# **Requirements for Graduation**

To satisfy the requirements for graduation, a student must successfully complete all requirements for admission and all courses in their prescribed curriculum. A cumulative quality-point grade average of not less than 2.0 is required for graduation, based on all work attempted while enrolled in the professional program. A candidate for degree must be determined by the faculty to be of good moral character and fit for the practice of the profession, must have paid all indebtedness to the University, and must be present at the ceremony where the degree is conferred (unless excused under University rules).

# History of Academic Regalia

The purpose of the Creighton University School of Pharmacy and Health Professions' Hooding Ceremony is to celebrate the individual scholarly and personal achievements of our clinical doctorate graduates as they prepare to receive their degrees during the University's commencement ceremony with other Creighton graduates.

The hood, cap, and gown are the visual components of the academic costume of commencement, with the hood reserved for those who attain the highest academic degrees beyond the bachelor's degree. Origins of academic attire are obscured in history, but it is likely that the distinctive dress of scholars is based on modifications of the ecclesiastical costumes of medieval clerics. The colors used for trimming of doctors' gowns, edging of hoods, and tassels of caps represent different professions and/or major disciplines.

Physical Therapy: Teal



# History of Creighton University

Edward and Mary Lucretia Creighton, along with Edward's brother, John, settled in Omaha in the 1850s. John married Mary Lucretia's sister, Sarah Emily Wareham, in 1868, and the four are considered the founders of Creighton University. Edward's work with the transcontinental telegraph and freighting, ranching, railroading and banking became a major force in the city's economic development. The two brothers were widely known for their business enterprises, and the two couples were also widely regarded for their philanthropy.

Edward died in 1874, and his widow included <sup>\$</sup>100,000 in her will to establish Creighton College in memory of her husband. Mary Lucretia died in 1876, and her executors, who included her brother-in-law John, purchased 6.2 acres of land at the northwest corner of what is currently 24th and California streets. The land and additional securities were transferred to Bishop James O'Connor of Omaha, and construction began on the school.


The bishop asked the Jesuits to operate the school and the first president, Roman A. Shaffel, sJ, arrived in Omaha in late 1877; the school opened on Sept. 2, 1878. One priest, two scholastics, a layman and a laywoman formed the faculty. The school began with 120 students ranging in age from 6 to 30. On Aug. 14, 1879, Bishop O'Connor surrendered his trust to the Jesuits, who incorporated "The Creighton University" under Nebraska law. Much of the initial teaching was below the collegiate level; in 1891, Creighton University awarded its first baccalaureate degree.



Edward and Mary Lucretia's generosity is credited with establishing Creighton College, while John and Sarah Emily's philanthropy enlarged it to a five-school university. Today, Creighton University consists of nine schools and colleges:

- College of Arts and Sciences (1878)
- School of Medicine (1892)
- School of Law (1904)
- School of Dentistry (1905)
- School of Pharmacy and Health Professions (1905)
- Heider College of Business (1920)
- Graduate School (1926)
- College of Nursing (1971; four-year bachelor's degree program began in 1958)
- College of Professional and Continuing Education (Established as University College in 1983)

### **Graduation Honors**

Students may graduate with honors. Criteria for graduation honors can be found in the Creighton University catalogs. Honors for students with previously conferred degrees are listed in this program. Honors for students with May degrees met the honors criteria based on Fall 2022 cumulative grade point averages. Official honors will be awarded on the transcript and diploma based on Spring 2023 cumulative grade point averages. Honors for students who anticipate completing their degree requirements in August or December are not listed in this program. Honors will be awarded on the transcript and diploma at the time of degree conferral.

### **Degree Conferral**

Creighton University confers degrees three times per year: August, December, and May. Annual University commencement ceremonies are held in May for all Colleges and Schools. The hooding ritual is included in the commencement ceremony for master and doctoral level students. An additional graduate level commencement ceremony is held in December. Students who complete their degree programs in August or December may attend the commencement ceremony following completion, or with the approval of the Office of the Dean, in the preceding May. Participation in a commencement ceremony does not guarantee a degree is officially earned. A degree is conferred only after the dean verifies all academic requirements are met and the degree is posted on the student's transcript by the Office of the Registrar.
